The ship recycling industry is slow yet steady, limited trades for foreign originated goods have been recorded in this week. We continue to link this lag in the Iron and Steel Industry to the upcoming General Body Elections which is between the month of April to May in different states of the country. We anticipate after the elections are concluded the market conditions will start trending and there might be an influx of vessels as the yards in this region are getting ready to resume their new inventory bookings.

Hunger continues for new tonnages among recyclers!

Despite of having excess inventory in hand, yards are still actively looking to buy tonnages that are available for recycling. Excess bookings can be linked to fill the gap that may arise on account of Ramadan celebrations. Since Bangladesh is highly dependent on raw materials to produce finished goods, it is importing both ships and raw materials of imported origin. Mills offer a comparatively better price for ship plates that attracts the recyclers to buy ships at high prices compared to other regions in the subcontinent. Ramadan celebrations followed by monsoons will affect the macros of economy keeping in mind the excess inventory that has hit this market.


Vessel heading to port Gadani after a long wait


