# **GLOBAL SHIP RECYCLING MARKETS**



With monsoon around the corner and 80% of workers returning back to their villages, ship recyclers in India might temporarily snooze their operations.

Peaking covid19 pandemic keeps all businesses in Bangladesh to focus only at meeting their ends, yet recyclers in this week made a couple of fresh bookings.

Financial budget for the fiscal year 2020-2021 have been announced in both Pakistan and Bangladesh. Ship recyclers feel that in this budget they wont be burdened with additional taxes.

Situation in Turkey is improving. Mills have booked large quantities of HMS scrap to increase their production and to restart their supply in European countries.

Interestingly, cash buyers that are active in the business are hiring chartered planes to make change of crew happen.



**INDIA** 



Ship recyclers in Alang are resistant to book new tonnages because:-

- 1) Coronavirus infection is spreading rapidly across the country, they fear that under such circumstances the Government may anytime impose 1 more round of lockdown.
- Monsoon is around the corner with limited workers to carry out the recycling.
- 3) Instability in the prices of ship plate.

Though beaching of ships with foreign crew is permitted in India with SOPs and guidelines, there still exists some confusion in the latest circular issues by the Ministry of Home Affairs that mentions, foreign crew of nationalities such as Chinese, Bangladeshi, Sri Lankan & Ethiopian are not allowed inwards.

The association "SRIA" have also approached the competent authorities for a clarification.

In Mumbai and Delhi, the coronavirus cases are increasing rapidly. These are priority-A cities within the country with highest containment zones. Experts fear that a second wave of virus might hit anytime soon in these region.

In the last week, Importation of containerized HMS was on a standstill.

Post covid19, mills have adopted the 'just in time' production technique. Hence prices of domestic scrap is not gaining any positive momentum neither in its demand nor in its price.

Beaching Dates: 2<sup>nd</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> June followed by 19<sup>th</sup> to 27<sup>th</sup> June, 2020





### **Covid19 Cases**

Confirmed – 87,520 Recovered – 18,730 (21%) Deaths – 1,171 Coronavirus is rapidly spreading across Bangladesh, all major industries here are operating at breakeven or notional losses. Importation of HMS scrap was not active in this week.

Recyclers with an appetite are buying vessels despite the slow-moving market conditions.

## **BANGLADESH**

In the budget announced for financial year 2020-2021 there is no major change of for ship recyclers. In fact there are certain tax benefits for the ease of doing business. This may eventually bring in some stability here.

Recyclers that had previously acquired large tonnages at a higher entry point are facing tremendous pressure in the present-day market.

Already there is surplus inventory for mills plus traders and recyclers are importing more supplies at a lower price point.

In this decade Bangladesh was regarded as a developing country but if the pandemic continues to spread like fire, in no time its status quo will reverse back to an underdeveloped country. Unfortunately, the economy may end up giving away its treasury to fight against the virus.

### **Covid19 Cases**

The financial budget for the year 2020-2021 has been announced. In the last 68 years, the economy has shrunken for its first time.

- 1) About 2% reduction will be granted in Additional custom
- 2) Advance income tax is reduced from 4.5% to 2% (discount of 2.5%)
- 3) More tax benefits for businesses involved in HMS scrap


## **PAKISTAN**

Ship recyclers are actively looking for tonnages as well as offers from cash buyers. The demand for HMS scrap continues to increase and we strongly feel that this demand is here to stay, until satisfied.

With Emirates first and now Etihad resuming its international air corridor from Pakistan, beaching of delivered ships with foreign national crew on board doesn't seem a big challenge any longer. In fact within the sub-continent, Pakistan is the only ship recycling nation that has opened its international airport for general public as well as stranded foreigners.

In coming weeks we may encounter a lot of vessels being sold to Port Gadani for its recycling purpose, which indeed is a good come back for the ship recycling community based out of this region.

Mills are trying to raise their production, due to this the demand for scrap is also increasing. Businesses in Europe are resuming with a marginal improvement in demand for Turkish rebars.

In this week, large cargoes of HMS 80:20 and shredded scrap were shipped from USA to Turkey.


## **TURKEY**


Non-green ship recyclers based out of this region are actively enquiring for tonnages. All EU-Approved yards are occupied.
